- Proof of income must be provided if the person has KCHIP III

The WIC Program can help stretch your food budget!

What is WIC?

WIC (short for Women, Infants and Children) is a free program that helps provide nutritious food and other services like breastfeeding support for participants.

Who Can Qualify for WIC?

- Pregnant women
- Postpartum women with an infant less than 6 months old
- Breastfeeding women with an infant less than 1 year old
- Women who miscarried in the past 6 months
- Infants and children under 5 years of age

~Participants must also meet income guidelines~

What is Needed to Sign Up for WIC?

Proof of Identity:

- Driver's License
- Work or School ID
- Hospital Birth Record
- Voter Registration Card
- Immunization Record

Proof of Residence:

- Current bill for electric, gas, telephone or cable
- Current lease or receipt
- Driver's license

*Kentucky WIC participants must be Kentucky residents.

Proof of Household Income:

- Food Stamp (SNAP) letter
- W-2 forms
- Signed statement from employer
- Income tax forms for most recent year
- Check stub/award letter from Social Security
- Recent Leave and Earnings Statement (LES) for military
- Foster child placement/award letter
- Copies of alimony or child support checks
- Statement from person(s) that provide you money/resources
- Current pay stub
- Unemployment letter
